What is Concurrent Enrollment?

AN OPPORTUNITY FOR YOU TO EARN COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE STILL IN HIGH SCHOOL

This program is designed for students in grades 9-12. Students apply for admission to EACC and once admitted, have the opportunity to take full advantage of this unique opportunity to learn.

EACC is excited about offering high school students this opportunity. Concurrent enrollment is the enrollment of a high school student in post secondary education for high school credit and college-level credit (1000 and 2000 level courses).

EACC will provide qualified instructors at your school or the school district may provide appropriately credentialed instructors according to the Arkansas Department of Higher Education (ADHE) standards.



A PERMANENT COLLEGE RECORD IS ESTABLISHED ONCE STUDENTS ARE ADMITTED TO THE PROGRAM AND BEGIN TO TAKE CLASSES.

TYPICAL COURSE OFFERINGS INCLUDE ENGLISH, PSYCHOLOGY, HISTORY, POLITICAL SCIENCE, SPANISH, AND OTHERS.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Q: Who should enroll in a concurrently offered course?
- A: Qualified students in grades 9-12 or those who plan to attend an institution of higher education.
- Q: What are the benefits?
- A: Students can investigate courses of study prior to enrollment in a degree or certificate program. The student can earn transferable credit towards a Bachelors or an Associate degree, and they have the benefit of learning under the guidance of EACC's outstanding faculty. The cost of the classes may be offset by scholarships (such as the Nimocks Oil Company Scholarship) or other resources. EACC has lower tuition and fees (approximately 1/3 the cost compared to the average cost of a 4-year public university).

Admission Requirements for Concurrently Enrolled Students

To ensure full consideration, all applicants should make sure they:



- Complete an EACC *Application for Admission*
- Complete an EACC *Application for Admission to the Concurrent Enrollment Program*
- Are currently enrolled in a high school program
- Have a minimum score of 19 on the ACT subtests (or comparable ASSET or COMPASS score) if enrolling in an English or math course
- Have a minimum reading score of 19 on the ACT or comparable scores on the ASSET or COMPASS
- Are recommended by their high school principal or designee
- Submit high school transcripts and Immunization Records to Admissions and Records at EACC



Is Financial Assistance Available?

Students are frequently assisted with concurrent enrollment in the cost of tuition and fees and books by many different kinds of resources including **The Nimocks Oil Company Scholarship**
