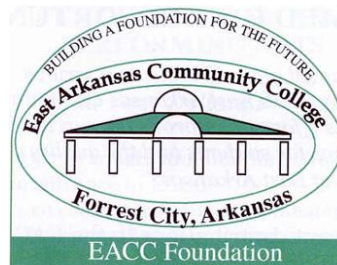

The George P. and Alice H. Walker Endowed Scholarship

The George and Alice Walker Endowed Scholarship was funded in 2004 through the estate of Mildred Sikes. Mrs. Sikes was the daughter of George and Alice Walker, both of whom preceded her in death.

The Walker family came to St. Francis County in about 1900 and started a farming operation. George Walker continued that family business until his death. Mrs. Walker was very active in the First United Methodist Church, serving for years as a Sunday school teacher. She was the first woman to serve on a grand jury in this state.

Because of the caring attention given members of this family, especially in their final days, this scholarship is dedicated to the support of students at EACC pursuing an Associate of Applied Science degree in an Allied Health field. It is expected that these students will become practicing health care professionals and provide care for many others over their lifetime.

The award is \$1,000 per academic year, divided by two semesters to cover expenses of tuition, fees and books. *See award procedures for exceptions.

Qualifications

- Have sufficient credit hours to be classified as a sophomore
- Be enrolled as a full-time student at EACC in an Allied Health Program
- Pursue a course of study leading to an Associate of Applied Science degree in an Allied Health field
- Have a cumulative 3.0 GPA
- Submit 3 letters of recommendation from college instructors
- Have, in the opinion of the selection committee, a true financial need
- Maintain a 3.0 GPA and full-time student status to receive second semester award

Award Procedures

- The deadline for application is **August 1st**
- The EACC Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee will review applications and select recipient(s) based upon the qualifications above
- *The Scholarship award will be for the 2008 spring semester only.
- The recipient will be notified as soon as possible
- The recipient must be willing to participate in publicity and news releases
