

EMS Program Instructor Job Description

Position Summary:

The EMT/Paramedic Instructor is responsible for preparing and implementing teaching and evaluation strategies for EMS students in the classroom as well as in the clinical settings.

Typical Functions:

The full time EMS Instructor is a 10.5-month faculty position. The individual must be able to teach didactic and clinical components. Perform teaching activities including classroom instruction, classroom management, and grade submissions. Prepare and implement teaching and evaluation strategies for EMS students in the classroom as well as in clinical settings. Participate in the development, planning, implementation, and evaluation of EMS curriculum and programs. The individual must maintain professional standards of practice in teaching in the classroom and in the clinical settings. Perform other duties and services for the College as assigned by the EMS Program Director and/or other College administrators residing over the Allied Health Division.

Minimum Qualifications:

A minimum of an Arkansas EMS Instructor License at EMT level (Paramedic Level is preferred) and a Technical Certificate in Paramedic. Associate's or Bachelor's Degree is preferred. Must have and maintain Arkansas licensure through NREMT. Must have a minimum of 2 years EMS experience. BLS Instructor credentials and ACLS Instructor credentials are preferred.
