



AR Enhanced Concealed Carry Course

Taught by certified concealed handgun safety instructor Buck Morris, this course offers a safe, friendly environment for Arkansas residents to qualify for an enhanced concealed carry license (E-CHCL). Classroom experience and firing qualification (to be held at a local range) meets the 2017 changes to A.C.A. §§ 5-73-101 to -324. The E-CHCL gives a licensee the ability to carry and possess a concealed handgun in more locations than the standard AR CHCL. The course training requirements are significantly more detailed and in-depth compared to the standard AR CHCL with more detailed classroom training in aspects of self-defense with a firearm, as well as a minimum accuracy on timed live-fire qualification requirements. Participants must be 21 years of age and a resident of the State of Arkansas. In addition, participants must already possess an Arkansas CHCL or must complete the basic Arkansas Concealed Carry class first.

Healthcare Provider CPR

The Healthcare Provider course teaches CPR skills for helping victims of all ages (including ventilation with a barrier device, a bag-mask device, and oxygen); use of an automated external defibrillator (AED); and relief of foreign-body airway obstruction (FBAO). This course is intended for participants who provide health care to patients in a variety of settings.

ServSafe Manager Certification

This 8 hour course is designed to provide professionals with critical knowledge and skills about food safety and sanitation. Arkansas regulations require that all food service establishments have at least one certified food protection manager on staff. This manager must pass a food safety exam accredited by the Conference for Food Protection or an equivalent exam. This course meets all Arkansas Department of Health requirements.

HeartSaver CPR

Hands-Only CPR can save lives. Anyone who experiences cardiac arrest at home, work, or in a public location dies because they do not receive immediate CPR from someone on the scene. As a bystander, do not be afraid. Your actions can only help. Hands-Only CPR performed by a bystander has shown to be as effective as CPR with breaths in the first few minutes of an out-of-hospital sudden cardiac arrest for an adult victim. Hands-Only CPR is CPR without mouth-to-mouth breaths. People who see an adult collapse in an "out-of-hospital" setting recommend it for use.

Safety for Janitorial Services

Janitorial and custodial staff face a wide range of workplace hazards, from chemical exposure to slips, trips, and falls. This course provides practical training to help employees perform their duties safely while protecting themselves, coworkers, and building occupants. This training emphasizes real-world scenarios and preventive practices that custodial staff can apply daily.

Eye Safety Training

Eye injuries can happen in an instant but have lifelong consequences. This course equips employees with the knowledge and habits needed to protect their vision on the job. Participants will learn how to recognize common workplace eye hazards and use proper protective measures to reduce risk.

Fall Protection Training

Falls are one of the leading causes of serious workplace injuries and fatalities. This course equips employees with the knowledge and skills to recognize fall hazards and use fall protection systems correctly, in compliance with OSHA standards (29 CFR 1926 Subpart M and 1910).

Hand & Power Tool Safety

Hand and power tools make our work faster and easier—but they also create serious hazards when not used properly. This class equips participants with the knowledge and skills to safely select, operate, and maintain a wide range of common workplace tools.

Workplace Fire Safety

Fires can start in seconds and spread in minutes. Being prepared can save lives, protect property, and keep your workplace safe. In this interactive class, participants will learn how to recognize fire hazards, prevent emergencies, and respond effectively if a fire occurs. Topics include OSHA fire safety standards, safe storage and housekeeping practices, evacuation procedures, and hands-on training in the proper use of fire extinguishers using the PASS method.

HAZWOPER Training

HAZWOPER training (Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response) is an OSHA-mandated program that provides workers with the knowledge and skills to safely handle hazardous substances and respond to emergency situations. It applies to employees engaged in operations involving hazardous waste cleanup, treatment, storage, or emergency response under 29 CFR 1910.120.

HAZCOM: Communication and Safety Data Sheets (SDS)

The OSHA Hazard Communication Standard (HAZCOM) requires employees to know how to handle hazardous chemicals safely. This class gives participants the skills to read, understand, and apply information from Safety Data Sheets (SDS), the key resource for chemical safety in the workplace.

HIPAA Privacy & Security Awareness

Protecting sensitive health information is everyone's responsibility. This class provides an overview of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) requirements, focusing on both privacy and security rules. Participants will learn how to safeguard patient information, recognize potential privacy breaches, and follow proper procedures for handling electronic health records (EHRs), email, and other data systems.

Lockout/Tagout Safety

Lockout/Tagout Safety
The Lockout/Tagout (LOTO) Course by EACC equips participants with the essential knowledge and skills required to implement OSHA-compliant hazardous energy control procedures. This course helps you understand the purpose and function of LOTO and familiarize yourself with various sources of hazardous energy, including electrical, mechanical, and hydraulic. The course meets the OSHA General Industry training requirements under 29 CFR 1910.147, ensuring compliance with federal safety standards.

Confined Space Safety Training

Working in confined spaces presents unique hazards that can quickly become life-threatening without proper precautions. This course prepares participants to recognize, evaluate, and control the risks associated with confined space entry, in compliance with OSHA standards (29 CFR 1910.146).

CDL Refresher Training

This CDL refresher courses is for truck drivers needing safety-based and continuing education training or who have previously held a CDL license and re-entering the CDL driver workforce.

Refresher courses include classroom instruction (up to 40 hours) on basic driver safety requirements, in-cab simulation maneuvering, and evaluation and readiness assessments.

Arkansas Workforce Challenge | AWC Scholarship

The Workforce Challenge Scholarship was created in the 2017 legislative session and is funded by lottery revenue. The purpose of the scholarship is for workforce training in high-demand areas of healthcare, information technology, and industry. Classes are not limited to credit-bearing programs. Non-credit, workforce-training classes that fit into three categories may also qualify. Be an Arkansas resident, must be a high school graduate or received high school equivalency and the student cannot be a current recipient of the Academic Challenge Scholarship. Scholarships for a maximum of \$800 to cover cost of tuition. Be accepted for admission in a program of study at an approved institution of higher education that leads to an associate degree or a certificate program in one of the following high-demand fields:



The **Delta Blues Museum** is dedicated to creating a welcoming place where visitors find meaning, value, and perspective by exploring the history and heritage of the unique American musical art form of the blues. The City of Clarksdale, MS, located at the intersection of Highways 61 and 49 ("the crossroads"), and the surrounding Delta region are known as "the land where the blues began".


The **Emmett Till Interpretive Center** is located in Sumner, MS, just across the street from the Tallahatchie County courthouse. This courthouse was the location of the 1955 Emmett Till Trial, where his murderers were acquitted by an all-white male jury. Today, as a part of the museum interpretation and historic preservation pillars of work, the center offers tours of the historical courthouse and surrounding areas that played a significant role in the story of Emmett Till.

Garvan Woodland Gardens is the botanical garden of the University of Arkansas, established in 1993 by an endowment from Mrs. Verna C. Garvan. Her vision is the foundation of the Garden's mission to serve the public and provide teaching and research opportunities for the Department of Landscape Architecture and the Fay Jones School of Architecture and Design.

As early as 1985, the Department of Landscape Architecture was utilizing portions of the 210 acres on Lake Hamilton, in Hot Springs, AR, as a resource to teach local ecology and design principles. Teaching opportunities continue in these areas and currently feature urban forestry, wetland ecology, construction methods and materials, design implementation, and horticulture. Numerous designed features offer case studies for landscape architecture and architecture students as well as professionals, including the Asiatic Garden by David Slawson, a nationally recognized Japanese garden designer, and the Verna C. Garvan Pavilion, by internationally recognized architects Fay Jones and Maurice Jennings.
